**FORD'S POLICIES MAKE MAJORITY OF VOTERS LESS LIKELY TO SUPPORT ANDREW SCHEER'S FEDERAL CONSERVATIVES**

**MAJORITY DISAGREE WITH BREAKING BEER STORE CONTRACT, INCLUDING ONE THIRD OF PC VOTERS**

**TWO THIRDS WANT DOUG FORD TO STEP ASIDE, INCLUDING ONE FIFTH OF PC VOTERS**

**FORD'S APPROVAL SINKS, "NET APPROVAL" IS NOW -53, DOWN 11 POINTS FROM LAST MONTH**

#### **Key Findings**

- **Majority less likely to vote for Scheer because of Ford's policies:** More than one half of Ontario voters agree Ford's policies in Ontario make them less likely to vote for Andrew Scheer's federal Conservatives in the next federal election (54%). This includes one fifth of Ontarians who voted Conservative in the last federal election (21%).
- **Majority disagree with breaking Beer Store contract, including one third of PCs:** The majority of Ontario voters disagree with breaking the Beer Store contract to put beer in convenience stores (52%), and this includes one third of PC voters (36%).
- **Two thirds agree Doug Ford should step aside in favour of another leader:** Two thirds of Ontario voters agree Doug Ford should step aside as premier in favour of another leader (62%), and this includes one fifth of PC voters (19%) and those who approve of Doug Ford (18%).
- **Fewer than one fifth approve of Doug Ford as Premier:** Fewer than one fifth of Ontario voters approve of Doug Ford (18%), and a total of 7-in-10 disapprove of him (71%), for a net approval (approve minus disapprove) of -53, well down from his net score from this time last month (-42 net, May 5, 2019)

- **PCs with slim lead if election held tomorrow:** One third of Ontario voters would support the PCs if an election were held tomorrow (32%), to just more than a quarter for the Liberals (26%) and the NDP (27%). When leaders' names are not associated with the parties, however, the PCs (31%) and the Liberals (28%) are tied within the margin of error, followed close behind by the NDP (25%).

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## Detailed Findings

### PCs with slim lead if election held tomorrow

TORONTO, JUNE 6, 2019 - In a sampling of public opinion taken by Corbett Communications on June 4 and 5, 2019, among an online sample of 1555 Ontario voters, one third would support the PCs if an election were held tomorrow (32%), compared to just more than a quarter for the NDP (27%) and the Liberals (26%). The Greens draw the support of just more than a tenth (13%).

These findings are from a split sample question methodology, in which one half the sample answered with leaders' names attached, and half the sample with only the parties mentioned. When party leaders' names are disassociated from the ballot question, the results are even tighter, and the PCs do not lead within the margin of error (PCs - 31%, Liberals - 28%, NDP - 25%, Greens - 15%). This represents a decline for the PCs (from 35% to 31%) and a very small increase for the Liberals (from 27% to 28%) and parity for the NDP (25% unchanged) from last month's Corbett Communications poll, when the split sample methodology wasn't used (May 6, 2019). The Greens have seen their vote share increase too (from 12% to 15%).

There is a distinct gender gap in these findings, in that more than one third of males will support the PCs (36%), while just more than a quarter of females will (27%). The PCs find their greatest support in Eastern Ontario (37%), and much less in Toronto (23%). Eight-in-ten past PC voters will support the party again (82%), while just fewer Liberals will support their party again this time around (77%). About one tenth of past Liberals (12%) and past NDP voters (7%) will vote for each other's parties if the election were held tomorrow.

### Ford's approvals lowest of all four party leaders.

Andrea Horwath enjoys the highest approval of the party leaders, at close to half (46%), followed by Mike Schreiner of the Green Party, at a quarter (26%), then John Fraser, interim leader of the Liberals, at one fifth (19%). Doug Ford has the approval of less than a fifth (18%), and this is comparable to the worst approval ratings ever associated with former premier Kathleen Wynne. When a "net approval" (approval minus disapproval) is examined, Horwath enjoys a very healthy net score of +31, Mike Schreiner clocks in at +16, John Fraser, a placeholder, has a net score of +4, while Doug Ford's net score is a truly bottomless -53. Ford's approval is highest among males (22%), the oldest (21%), PC voters (67%) and, to a lesser extent, federal Conservative voters (49%).

## **Just one quarter agrees Ontario is moving in the right direction; 6-in-10 say wrong direction**

Just one quarter of Ontario voters agree the province is moving in the right direction (25%), and this is more common to males (33%), PC voters (68%), those who approve of Doug Ford (75%), but just more than one half of those who voted PC in the last election (56%), and those who voted Conservative in the last federal election (58%). This attitude is slightly more common in Eastern Ontario (28%) and the GTA outside Toronto (28%) than elsewhere.

Six-in-ten agree Ontario is moving in the wrong direction (61%), and this is most common among females (66%), the youngest (65%), New Democrats (86%), those who disapprove of Doug Ford (82%) and in Northern Ontario (66%).

## **Two thirds agree Ford is more interested in dismantling Wynne's legacy than building a better Ontario.**

Two thirds of Ontarians agree Doug Ford is more interested in dismantling former premier Kathleen Wynne's social programs than he is in building a better Ontario (63%), while just one quarter disagree (23%). Agreement is more common among females (67%), New Democratic voters (88%), those who disapprove of Ford (83%) and in Northern Ontario (69%).

## **Just one third agrees Ford is making the "hard but necessary choices needed to trim the deficit"**

Only one third of Ontario voters agree that the premier is making hard, but necessary choices in order to reduce the deficit (32%), while the majority disagree (55%). Agreement is found among males (38%), PC voters (80% agree, 12% disagree) and among Doug Ford partisans (87%).

## **Two thirds agree Ford is using deficit reduction as excuse to cut social programs**

As many as two thirds of Ontario voters agree Doug Ford is using deficit reduction just as an excuse to engage in cutting social programs (66%), and this feeling is most common to females (69%), New Democrats (90%), those who disapprove of Doug Ford (87%). In addition, one third of past PC voters agree (35%), as do one third of past federal Conservative voters (38%).

### **Two thirds agree Doug Ford should step aside in favour of another leader including significant proportion of PC voters and federal Conservatives**

As many as two thirds of Ontarians agree Doug Ford should step aside in favour of another leader (62%), and this includes as many as one fifth of current PC supporters (19%) and those who approve of Doug Ford (18%), and as many as one third past PC voters (28%) and past federal Conservative voters (33%). Just one quarter of voters do not agree Ford should step aside (25%), including just two thirds of current PC supporters (69%), even fewer past PC supporters (59%) and a similar proportion of past federal Conservative voters (57%).

### **Seven-in-ten, including many PC and Conservative supporters, agree Ford has priorities backward by increasing speed limits and access to alcohol, while cutting public health and education.**

Fully 7-in-10 Ontario voters agree that the premier has his priorities backwards, emphasizing higher speed limits and more open access to alcohol, while cutting funds for public health and education (71%), and this opinion is shared by females (76%), New Democrats (92%) and in Northern Ontario (74%). Even among his partisans and allies, significant minorities agree the premier has his priorities backwards (current PCs - 34%, Past PCs - 46%, past federal Conservatives - 46%).

### **Majority disagree with breaking Beer Store contract, including significant minorities of Ford allies**

Just one quarter agree with this policy (27%), while the majority disagree (52%). Among those disagreeing, most prominent are the oldest (63%), Liberals (64%) and New Democrats (66%), those disapproving of Ford (60%) and those in, surprisingly, Northern Ontario (56%). Support for the idea is common to males (33%), the youngest (32%), current PC supporters (44%), past PC voters (38%), past federal Conservatives (37%) and in Eastern Ontario (33%). It is notable that it is only among the strong partisans of Doug Ford that the majority agrees with breaking the Beer Store contract (51%). Among current PCs (36%), past PC voters (43%) and past federal Conservative voters (44%), only the minority agree with the policy.

## **Majority agree Doug Ford's policies in Ontario make it harder to vote for Andrew Scheer's Conservatives in a federal election.**

More than one half of Ontarians agree that Doug Ford's policies in Ontario have made them less likely to vote for the Conservatives, led by Andrew Scheer, in the next federal election (54%). This position is especially common to females (57%), the youngest (60%), current provincial Liberals (84%), those who disapprove of Ford (75%), past federal Liberal (75%) and NDP (74%) voters, as well as somewhat fewer Green voters (69%). This position is most common in Northern Ontario (60%) and in Toronto (59%).

It is notable that agreement with the position that Ford makes it more difficult to vote for Scheer is relatively common among both provincial and federal conservatives (current PC supporters - 12%, past PC voters - 20%, past federal Conservative voters - 21%).

### **Conclusion**

"After striking out in the last round of polls, the PCs have tried to hit a home run with beer sales in convenience stores. However, this policy has turned into an infield fly because of fears about tearing up the Beer Store contract.

Worse, it appears he is muddying the Ontario waters for the federal Conservatives, who know the next election will be won or lost in Ontario. If he is alienating voters from voting for Andrew Scheer, who *was* on a roll, he will hear about it.

When as many as 3-in-10 of those who voted for him just one year ago agree he should now step down, one has to wonder how long he can hold on to power. After all, his vote share now is lower than Andrea Horwath's was in the last election." said John Corbett, principal and founder of Corbett Communications.

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## Methodology

This poll was conducted by Corbett Communications on June 4 and 5, 2019, among an online sample of 1555 Ontario voters 18 years of age and older who are members of Maru/Blue's Maru Voice Canada Online Panel. Panel members are recruited to reflect the population profile described in 2016 Statistics Canada data and are paid various incentives for their participation.

As this is an opt-in sample, no margin of error is presented. For comparison purposes, a randomly selected sample of this size would have a margin of error of plus or minus 3%, nineteen out of twenty times asking.

Where appropriate, data have been weighted to ensure the sample matches the actual population profile according to the latest Statistics Canada data.

For the provincial ballot question (the horserace), a split sample methodology is employed, where one half the sample is read the parties' names with no leader attached, and half the sample is asked with leaders' names attached.

This poll is not intended to predict future outcomes but is a "slice of time" view of public opinion. Corbett Communications has released this poll in the public interest and has no stake in its results.
