FEDERAL LIBERALS WITH 8 POINT LEAD IN ONTARIO

NEVERTHELESS, VOTERS EXPECT HUNG PARLIAMENT

**CLOSE TO 6-IN-10 ARE LESS LIKELY TO VOTE FOR
ANDREW SCHEER DUE TO DOUG FORD'S POLICIES**

**VAST MAJORITY AGREE CANADA IS ONE OF
THE BEST PLACES IN THE WORLD TO LIVE**

**SMALL MINORITY SUPPORT POLICIES OF DONALD TRUMP,
BUT CLOSE TO HALF OF FORD SUPPORTERS DO**

DETAILED FINDINGS

The federal Liberals have a growing lead over the Conservatives among Ontario voters.

TORONTO, AUGUST 16, 2019 - In an online sampling of public opinion taken by Corbett Communications among 1099 Ontario voters 18 years of age and older between August 11 and August 13, close to 4-in-10 Ontario voters will support the federal Liberals in the upcoming October federal election (39%), compared to about 3-in-10 who will support the federal Conservatives (31%). This is in comparison with last month, when the spread between the two parties federally was 5 points (38% to 33%). The federal NDP (14%) and Greens (12%) continue to be tied in voters' favour, as they were last month (14% and 13%, respectively). The Peoples' Party of Canada draws just less one twentieth of the vote in Ontario (4%), but this is up from last month (1%). It must be expected this vote is coming from the Conservatives.

In contrast to the Liberals, for whom 7-in-10 of 2015 federal Liberal voters will vote again (69%), and the Conservatives, where three quarters of 2015

supporters will vote their party again (77%), just one half of those who voted NDP in 2015 will vote NDP again (52%), whereas one fifth will vote Liberal (18%) or Green (17%) this time around. In a similar vein, just one half of Green voters from 2015 (52%) will vote their party again, while most of the rest will vote Liberal (27%). About one tenth of 2015 Liberals will vote Conservative (11%), NDP (9%) or Green (10%) this time around.

However, federal parties tied in voter expectations

Voters have equally high expectations for an electoral victory by either the Liberals (37%) or the Conservatives (36%) in October, and few expect victory for the NDP (5%), the Green Party (2%), the Peoples' Party of Canada (2%) or the Bloc Quebecois (1%). Those seeing a Liberal victory tend to be 55 to 65 years (43%) or 65 and older (44%), in the city of Ottawa (51%), Northern (46%) and Eastern Ontario (43%) and the city of Toronto (50%) and past New Democrats and Greens (35% each). Those vested in a Conservative victory tend to be male (37%), 25 to 34 years (40%), in the GTA surrounding Toronto (42% and 41%) and in Southwest Ontario (43%). They include past Conservatives (70%), but past New Democrats and Greens as well (22% each), those who approve of Doug Ford (68%) and Donald Trump's policies (61%).

Voters still shy of voting for Scheer, because of Ford's policies

Close to 6-in-10 Ontario voters say they will be less likely to vote for Andrew Scheer's Conservatives because of the policies of Doug Ford (56%) and this proportion has remained consistent (June - 54%, July - 60%). Those who take this position are more likely to be female (62%) than male (49%), 55 to 64 years old (60%), in the city of Toronto (68%), among Liberals and New Democrats (83% and 82%, respectively) but not so much among Greens (69%) and among those who disagree with the policies of Donald Trump (64%). Among current PC supporters, close 1-in-7 say they are less likely to vote Conservative federally (14%) because of Ford's policies, similar to the proportion of current federal Conservative supporters (15%). This increase to one fifth (19%) among those who actually voted Conservative in 2015.

Vast majority agree Canada is one of the best places in the world to live

More than 8-in-10 agree Canada is one of the best places in the world to live (84%), while fewer than a tenth take the opposite position (disagree - 8%). Agreement is especially characteristic of the oldest (93%), in Northern Ontario (87%), among Provincial Liberals (91%) and among federal Liberals (92%), those who approve of Andrea Horwath (90%) and those who do not support the policies of Donald Trump (90%). Disagreement that Canada is one of the best places in the world to live, while rare, is slightly more common to the young (25 to 34 years old - 12%), Provincial PC voters (12%), Green Party provincial voters (13%), federal New Democrats (12%) and Greens (13%), supporters of the Peoples' Party of Canada (25%), past Green Party voters, both provincial (16%) and federal (17%), among those who approve of Doug Ford (14%) and among those who support the policies of Donald Trump (20%).

Small minority support the policies of Donald Trump, including one half of Doug Ford supporters.

Just 1-in-7 voters agrees they support the policies of Donald Trump (15%), and these outliers are commonly found among males (23%) rather than females (8%), among the youngest (under 35 - 18%), in Eastern Ontario (27%), among supporters of the PC party provincially (39%), the Conservatives federally (31%) and, especially, the Peoples' Party of Canada federally (52%) and those who approve of Doug Ford (47%).

Conclusion

"We are seeing a slow but incremental widening of the federal Liberal lead in Ontario. This is caused more by vote drain from the Conservatives to the PPC than it is by organic Liberal vote share growth. The four or five points of right-of-centre support the PPC is attracting is enough to upset the delicate electoral equilibrium which has always existed in vote-rich Ontario, where elections are won, and lost. However, voters expect a very close election, and they may be more prescient than they know. The relationship between Ford supporters and support for the policies of Donald Trump is interesting; it may offer a clue to the reluctance of many voters to support Andrew Scheer's Conservatives, given their associations" said John Corbett, principal and founder of Corbett Communications.

Methodology

This poll was conducted by Corbett Communications between August 11 and 13, 2019, among an online sample of 1099 Ontario voters 18 years of age and older who are members of Maru/Blue's Maru Voice Canada Online Panel. Panel members are recruited to reflect the population profile described in 2016 Statistics Canada data and are paid various incentives for their participation.

As this is an opt-in sample, no margin of error is presented. For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size would have a margin of error of plus or minus 3%, nineteen out of twenty times asking.

Where appropriate, data have been weighted to ensure the sample matches the actual population profile according to the latest Statistics Canada data.

This poll is not intended to predict future outcomes but is a "slice of time" view of public opinion. Corbett Communications has released this poll in the public interest and has no stake in its results.
